


A four-day route through the essentials of the island

DÍA 1 Zona metropolitana: Santa Cruz y La Laguna




The metropolitan area is the center of life in Tenerife. In Santa Cruz and La Laguna the main cultural, shopping and leisure offer of the island is concentrated. Both cities have a valuable historical and architectural heritage, as well as museums, large parks and squares. The municipalities of El Rosario and Tegueste also belong to the metropolitan area.

Tradition and modernity are mixed in the two main cities of Tenerife, perfectly **connected to each other**, thanks to their own public transport, buses and trams. On the other hand, both also have impressive natural landscapes and their own beach areas.

For this four-day trip, we recommend that you stay

in the metropolitan area, as you will have greater facilities to visit it, as well as the north and south of the island of Tenerife.

As a starting point for this four-day trip, we plan the city of Santa Cruz de Tenerife as it is

from the capital of the island. It was founded in 1494, after the conquest. The pleasant climate of the city, together with its open-air shopping areas, make it the perfect place to shop or enjoy its wide gastronomic offer.

ÿ A place to have breakfast, lunch or a scandalous snack

Before starting to enjoy everything the city has to offer, we recommend you recharge your batteries with a

scandalous breakfast, and for that we have Sabela Bar & Food Market. This place, located on the wellknown Numancia street, in the heart of the city, in addition to offering scandalous gourmet breakfasts, both at home and on the premises, has a *wine bar area*, as well as a lunch service. and dinners.



From Plaza Weyler you can access the beginning of **Calle** del Castillo, one of the oldest streets in the city.


A pedestrian area of shops, commerce and open-air



Returning to our tour of the city, near Calle del Castello, specifically on the parallel street, is the *Guimerá theatre*, the oldest in the Cana<u>ry Islands. Following</u> this you can see the **General Serrador bridge** that leads to the emblematic **Market** of Our Lady of Africa.

The Market of Our Lady of Africa, also

popularly known as "La Recova", is a neocolonial architectural style building that houses the city's municipal market. Inside you can enjoy numerous stalls selling local fresh produce, as well as small places to eat or snack.

Inside the Market, we recommend that you enjoy a meal or a snack at **Nicomedes.** This place, specialized in seafood and fresh fish, allows you to buy to take home as well as eat there, since it has some small tables. A good place to enjoy freshly caught fish and seafood.

In addition, it has a second location, **EI Capricho de Nicomedes,** located on Anaga Avenue.

Next to the Market you can see the building that houses the Tenerife Espacio de las Artes (TEA). An architectural complex that houses a museum and contemporary art center, as well as the

Isla de Tenerife Photography Center and the Central Municipal Library.

If you take San Sebastián Avenue in the direction of the coast, you will arrive at the Museum of Nature and Archeology. The entrance to this is located in front of the Barranco de Santos and a bridge that connects with Afilar mónica Nifú-Nifá street, parallel to La Noria street, an area with a great carnival tradition. In addition, from here you can see the **Church of La Concepción**.

Once you have finished visiting this area, all pedestrian and connected to each other, we recommend that, if you do not want to walk, you use the tram and from the Fundación stop, located in front of the Church of La Concepción, head towards the **Santa** Cruz de Tenerife interchange.



Now it's time to walk from the Interchange, but only a few meters along La Constitución avenue and you'll arrive at the Tenerife Adán Martín Auditorium. Located on the seafront, it houses the current headquarters of the Tenerife Symphony Orchestra. It has an extensive cultural program throughout the year and has become an emblem of the capital.

Santa Cruz de Tenerife can be visited perfectly in one morning, in the same way that a full day can be dedicated to the visit. In addition, it offers a large number of restaurants where you can enjoy. We leave you here the link to the recommendations of Marca Canaria.

Your second stop on this trip is La Laguna, a city that, since 1999, has been recognized as a Cultural Asset and a World Heritage Site by UNESCO. **You can get there using the tram itself** from any of its stops on Line 1 and getting off **at Trinidad.**

La Laguna, **also known as the City of the Adelantados**, has a long history, since, like Santa Cruz, it **was founded between 1496 and 1497,** after the conquest. In addition, it was the **first colonial city without walls in the Canary Islands** and the only one that preserves its original layout from the 15th century practically intact.

If you used the Tram to get to the city, the most comfortable way to do it, you could enjoy the views during the trip, since La Laguna is the last stop on the route that connects the capital of the island with this city.



Before arriving in Trinidad, you passed several stops of interest within the municipality of San Cristóbal de La Laguna. First, **the Guajara Campus**, one of the five campuses that make up the University of La Laguna. Second, *the Museum of Sciences and the Cosmos*, opened in 1993.

Once you arrive at the **Trinidad stop**, you will find yourself on one of the main access roads to the city, Avenida de La Trinidad. From there you can easily explore the old town of La Laguna on foot.

The tour begins on Herradores street. One of the

several pedestrian streets that the city has. In it you will find shops, bars and restaurants. Continuing along this street or any of its parallels, you will arrive at the **Plaza de la Concepción,** one of the

most important in the old town of La Laguna. This is located next to the emblematic **Church of Nuestra Señora de la Concepción.**

The visit continues along the street parallel to Herradores, also pedestrian, **Obispo Rey Redondo street.** Like the rest of the streets of La Laguna, this one mixes classic buildings with the most modern shops and entertainment venues and restaurants. The first thing you will find down the street is the emblematic *Teatro Leal.*

ÿ A traditional place to have a snack

El Aderno is one of the most famous sweet shops in the island. Its main headquarters are located in Buenavista del Norte and it opened its doors for the first time in 1991. Specializing in both typical sweets and modern and current pastries, Aderno has a small headquarters in the city of La Laguna, just on Calle

Farriers. We recommend that you order, above all, their famous rosquetes.


Another point of architectural interest in the city is its **Cathedral.** Without a doubt, if La Laguna is recognized for something, it is for its important and historic buildings. Be sure to visit the Casa Salazar, the Convent of San Agustín, the Casa Montañés or the Casa de los Jesuitas.

Both by Herradores street and by Obispo Rey Redondo street we can reach our next stop and obligatory if you visit the city of La Laguna: La Plaza del Adelantado.

The Plaza del Adelantado is located in the center of the old town. Around it is the Town Hall, the Hermitage of San Miguel Arcángel from the 16th century, the Palacio de Nava and the Monastery of Santa Catalina de Siena.

From Plaza del Adelantado you should head towards Calle Viana, another pedestrian street, which will take you to your next stop: Plaza del Cristo de La Laguna. The *Municipal Market* is located there . In this you can buy fresh local products, as well as taste some tapas.

To end your visit to the city of La Laguna, we recommend that you go see the sunset at the Mirador **de Jardina.** It is located on the outskirts of the city, right at the beginning of the Anaga Rural Park. This viewpoint offers you incredible views of the city, as well as the majesty of the Teide volcano.

Yesterday you toured the cities of Santa Cruz and La Laguna and finished your route at the Mirador de Jardina, right at the beginning of **the Anaga Rural Park,** where we are going today.

ÿ A nice place to have breakfast

To start the day with energy it is necessary to have a good breakfast. *Makika & Co* on Calle San Juan in La Laguna is a cozy place, with a wonderful patio, where you can enjoy a full breakfast.

In its menu it has delicious sandwiches, *croissants* and sweets, all handmade, but also with wonderful *brunch,* natural juices, hamburgers and salads.











Less than an hour's drive from the city of La La

Guna and the capital of the island, Santa Cruz, is Anaga. The Anaga Rural Park is a space of great landscape, natural and cultural relevance. Declared a Biosphere Reserve by UNESCO on June 9, 2015, the park has the **largest number of endemics** in Europe.



Views of the Anaga Rural Park

With an area of nearly 15,000 hectares, the park is a massif of mountains covered with laurel, with sharp edges and deep ravines that reach the sea, many of them in the form of wild beaches. If you really want to enjoy the wonders of the Anaga Rural Park, we invite you to do some of its circular routes or walk one of its many trails.



Access to the Anaga Rural Park can be done both through Santa Cruz, from San Andrés, and through La Laguna, from Las Mercedes. We recommend that, since yesterday you finished your visit to the city of La Laguna at the gates of the park, today you start your day from there and head towards Taganana through Anaga.


Taganana is the most important town in the interior of the Anaga massif and one of the oldest towns on the island. In addition, it represents the beginning or the end of numerous routes and trails that run through and through the

park.

ÿ The heroic cultivation of the vine in Taganana

In addition, Taganana is an **area known for the almost heroic cultivation of vines.** The cultivation of vineyards in this area experienced its greatest boom in the mid-eighteenth century and, today, there are several wineries that have ventured to cultivate in this area where the orography plays a role in the form of an enemy. However, it is the characteristics of the land that give the wines that real expression of typicity and soils.

Margalagua in Taganana, plot of the Envínate project




Taganana is a true Jurassic park of varieties so old that they cannot be given an exact age. Some of the projects currently working in this area are: *Envínate, led* by winemaker Roberto Santana and the entire team; *Luck of the Marquis, with Jonathan* García at the helm; and Viñátigo, a project run by a young viticulturist, Jorge Méndez.

If you are interested in the world of viticulture, do not hesitate to Make a visit to the wineries and learn more about these worldrenowned projects, for example, by renowned magazines such as *The Wine Advocate* and its scores, and have positioned Ta Ganana on the world wine map.






The drive from La Laguna to Tagana na is 33 kilometers and takes approximately one hour. It is a short distance, but when you begin to immerse yourself in the park, you will realize that **the roads are the** ones that fit in with the orography. It is a beautiful route, but full of curves, so **if you are one of those** who get seasick, keep that in mind!

Once you get closer to the coast, you can already see the white houses scattered among the green of the mountain, as well as the **Roques de Anaga Integral Nature Reserve**, a protected area on the coast, which has two of the most emblematic natural monuments of Tenerife. Also the **Roque Amogoje**, known as "the lion of Taganana".



After the main core of Taganana, you will continue descending in the direction of **Almáciga. Both this area and Benijo are known for their incredible wild,** almost movie-like, black volcanic sand beaches. It is an ideal area to spend a pleasant day and disconnect from the hustle and bustle of the city.

In the almáciga area is **the Roque de las Bodegas beach**, perfect for going with the family. It is very quiet and has nearby places where you can **enjoy a lunch where the protagonist is the fresh fish** caught in the area and prepared following the Canarian recipe book.



ÿ Where to have lunch?

You are in a coastal area where fish is a main part of most of the menus of all the places. It is a good time for you to enjoy a good little fish, an octopus or some limpets. The *Casa África restaurant,* located on the Roque de las <u>Bodegas beach itself, and specializing in fish and shellfish,</u> as well as typical Canarian homemade food, is ideal for lunch listening to the sound of the sea.


If you decide to eat here, it is essential that you order the fried octopus, you will love it!

Just over a kilometer from Almáciga, following the only road there is, you come to the **Benijo farmhouse**. To get to its beach, of the same name, you have to go down a staircase, but the stretch is worth it, because the beach is impressive, one of the most beautiful, wild, and little traveled on the island. In addition, it offers one of the most spectacular sunsets in Tenerife.






Sunset from Benijo Beach

Of the many routes you can take through the Park Rural de Anaga, from Marca Canaria we want to recommend the following:

ÿ Chamorga - Roque Bermejo. Chamorga is a small town located inside the park. The route begins and ends in the same town, as it is a circular path. Going down the ravine you can closely appreciate the rich flora and fauna of Anaga, until you reach the Hermitage of Fátima and Roque Bermejo Beach. The ascent is made through the area of the Anaga Lighthouse, the oldest in the Canary Islands, and skirts the slopes of Mount Tafada, from where the spectacular views of the coast can be appreciated.



- ÿ Cruz del Carmen Punta del Hidalgo. This path is one of the most complete, since while doing it you can appreciate the mixture of landscapes offered by the Anaga Rural Park.
 Contrary to the previous route, this is not circular, so you must take this into account when organizing transportation. The trail can be started at the Cruz del Carmen Visitor Center. The route is practically all downhill, so it is not very demanding.
- ÿ Afur-Taganana. It is one of the most beautiful trails in Tenerife.
 It can be started in either of the two towns, Afur or Taganana.
 You can enjoy the farmhouses and landscapes of the north coast of Anaga and Tamadiste beach. In rainy seasons, the path becomes even more impressive, as the Afur ravine fills

with puddles and streams worth admiring. In addition, during the tour you will be able to closely appreciate the archaeological site known as **Piedra de los Guanches**, associated with the mummification practices of the island's aborigines.

We recommend you do the return in the Santa direction Cruz to visit **San Andrés as well.** This town is located a few minutes from the center of the capital of Tenerife and also belongs to the district of Anaga, being the most populated.

San Andrés is also characterized as a fishing village and although it is quite small, you can enjoy a pleasant walk along the sea.

ÿ A nice place to have dinner

If you want to enjoy an excellent product, worked with good technique, lavish in creativity and, furthermore, with magnificent room service, *La Posada del Pez* is the ideal place to enjoy a good dinner after a relaxing day at the beach or route through Anaga.

The restaurant is characterized by always using the best raw materials from local markets, but also international ones, respecting seasonality and sustainability. In addition, it seeks to innovate from traditions with raw, pickled, marinated, stews.... Its menu is based on fish and shellfish using the "makado", a Japanese oven, which provides grilled and smoked flavor. Also, since 2015, it has received the Bib Gour mand award from the Michelin Guide. A visit that you will love!

Very close to San Andrés is the most famous and touristic beach in Santa Cruz, Las Teresitas. An artificial beach of white sand brought from the Sahara. A few kilometers from this, is the beach of Las Gaviotas with black volcanic sand and frequented by chicharreros.



Following the road towards Igueste de San Andrés you will arrive at one of the most photographed viewpoints on the Island: the Mirador de Las Teresitas, from where you can appreciate the majesty of the beach and the Tenerife coastline.

If you decide to travel to Tenerife, an essential stop on any visit to the island is the northern part of the island, which offers incredible views of the majestic Teide volcano, the highest peak in Spain, without having to access the National Park directly. to temper it.

The Teide National Park is located in the **center of** the island of Tenerife and is the largest and oldest of the national parks in the Canary Islands. It was declared as such in 1954 and a World Heritage Site by UNESCO in 2007. From Marca Canaria we recommend that you spend a few hours visiting it and enjoy all the natural potential that it offers.

It has four access routes, we recommend that you go up one of them and down another, so that you can better enjoy the different landscapes, as well as the changing flora and fauna depending on where you are on the island. These four ways are:

ÿ To the north. TF-21 road. From La Orotava to Las Cañadas (Portillo de la Villa).

- *ÿ* **To the east.** Dorsal road TF-24. From La Laguna (La Esperanza) to Portillo de la Villa.
- ÿ To the south. TF-21 road. From Granadilla, passing through Vilaflor, to Las Cañadas (Boca de Tauce).
- ÿ To the west. TF-38 road. From Chío to Las Cañadas

(Mouth of Tauce).

As in today's tour, in addition to the National Park, we will also visit some of the most significant areas in the north of the island of Tenerife. We recommend that **you start your route towards Teide from the east and descend from the north.**

As you may have seen in the previous days, from the capital or any area of the metropolitan area you can go anywhere on the island without any problem thanks to the good connections available, as well as the short distances to travel.

In just over an hour by car, you can go from being in Santa Cruz to being on the other side of the island.

Today we will go up to the Teide National Park through La Laguna, more specifically along the La Esperanza road, crossing its green mountain.

La Esperanza is a rural area on the island of Tenerife that belongs to the municipality of El Rosario. From La La guna it is easy to access the town following the signs indicating La Esperanza and Teide National Park.

This area has a multitude of typical food establishments.

ÿ Where to eat in La Esperanza?

If what you want is to have breakfast in the area, you can go to the famous **Las Cañadas candy store.** Keep in mind that this one is only open on weekends! A very characteristic establishment in the area that offers a confectionery, pastry and traditional bakery service. If your visit to the National Park coincides with a weekend day, don't hesitate to stop.







In the north of the island, wines are made with DO Valle de la Orotava, which includes the municipalities of La Orotava, Los Realejos and Puerto de la Cruz, favored by the pleasant climate of the area, the volcanic soils and the trade winds. Once the visit to Villa de La Orotava is over, it is essential to visit Puerto de la Cruz. The northern area of Tenerife has a lot of charm, as well as a multitude of old towns and villages to visit. If you do not have much time, at least, we recommend that you visit Garachico.

Visiting Garachico is essential if you travel to Tenerife. Resurrected from the ashes of the Trevejo volcano, which buried practically the entire town in 1706, it is one of the most beautiful towns in Spain and has a great architectural and landscape heritage.





The municipality of Candelaria is located a few kilometers from Santa Cruz de Tenerife. Its municipal capital is Villa de Candelaria and from Marca Canaria we recommend that you make a stop on your way to visit it as it is a coastal area, seat of the Virgen de **Candelaria**, patron saint of the Canary Islands. It is the place of pilgrimage par excellence of the Archipelago, as well as a nucleus of historical importance since both the Guanche and Castilian cultures coexisted here after the conquest. You can enjoy a pleasant day at the beach here, as well as take the opportunity to eat a good fresh fish.


At the El Ancla restaurant, located in the Arenas del Mar Hotel in El Médano, they are also lovers of fish, but in this case blue fish, especially local and seasonal tuna. At the premises, they bet on a casual and beachy guy, giving a modern and profound vision to recipes whose main ingredient is seasonal tuna. In addition, the restaurant is located in a beautiful setting facing the sea and has a wonderful terrace.



Beaches to remember is what you will find in El Médano. The chicharrero coastline is a beach universe that must be discovered slowly and over time. The Teide volcano splits the island in two, thus giving it different characteristics. If the north zone stands out for its black sand beaches of volcanic origin, the south of Tenerife does so for the gold of its sands.

The beaches of El Médano and La Tejita are very close to each other. Located at the foot of Montaña Roja, El Médano beach concentrates all that is good in the natural and the urban. This beach, with golden sands, is connected by a coastal promenade along the two kilometers of coastline that the beach has. This walk connects the area closest to the town, with a family atmosphere and all the comforts, with the most active area, where the wind is welcome and attracts fans of windsurfing and kitesurfing.

To the west of Montaña Roja is La Tejita beach. Montaña Roja is nothing more than the remains of an ancient reddish volcanic cone that gives the La Tejita sandbank unique, almost Martian characteristics. In addition, it is the largest natural sand beach in **Tenerife** and proudly holds the blue flag, despite the fact that the wind is typical throughout this area.

However, these are not the only two impressive beaches in El Médano. From Marca Cana ria we want to recommend a third beach, or rather a cove, frequented by locals and not at all touristy, Montaña Pelada beach. To access it, it is necessary to take a short route of no more than ten minutes between sandbanks and dunes to the coast, but it is worth it.



The Montaña Pelada Natural Monument will give you the opportunity to see how a volcanic cone is formed from an underwater eruption. Its golden sand beach is quiet, sheltered from the characteristic wind of the area, and offers a landscape worth contemplating.



Once again on the TF-1, once you leave the Tenerife Sur airport behind, you are very close to your destination and also to Vilaflor, another of the many towns on the island that deserve to be visited.

Vilaflor is considered the highest town in Spain

and one of the most beautiful in the Canary Islands. In addition, it is located within the Corona Forestal Natural Park itself, which is why it stands out for its rural landscapes and pine forests. Like many rural areas of Tenerife, in the past it was an important grazing and humane region and has a great wine-growing tradition.

Vilaflor can be reached through the TF-1 through the south of the island and continue along secondary roads following the signs until reaching the town, or, from the north, using the TF-21 and crossing the Parque Nacional del Mount Teide.




